Hirata Atsutane was born in Akita in 1776.

He was a shinto scholar in the late Edo period.

And he greatly influenced the principle of reverence for the Emperor and the elimination of foreigners movement.

Then he lived in a temporarily house.

It was in the precinct of Hisaizu Shrine.



And then his wife was from Koshigaya.

Her father helped Atsutane financially and became one of Atsutane's disciples.
